## Scholarship Committee By Brenda Lowe

TUESDAY, AUGUST 20 | The Scholarship Committee is in the process of reviewing the submitted essays for scholarship consideration. There were a total of 110 new applicants this year. Scholarships are awarded in September.

We renewed three of the four recipients from last year for 2024-25 at \$1,000 each to continue our support and help them graduate. The fourth recipient graduated. The beginning balance of the funds stands at \$8,321.00. After we award the three renewed scholarships to help them graduate... it leaves a remaining \$5,321.00. However, SMWL Foundation still owes \$1,000.00 of our \$3,000.00 annual commitment... and we will pay that at *Giving Tuesday* in early December. Therefore, \$6,321.00 can be awarded at \$1,000 each to six students for the 2024-2025 School Year.

The scholarships we provide each year help local students in need pay for their education and necessary expenses to help them attain their goals and improve theirs and their families lives.





As an older student going back to school after 19 years is a struggle on its own. To have the financial backing and not have to take it out of our paychecks is a huge blessing. To have been raised by a single mother and to have watched her strug-

gles. I wish I could share this with her, but she has now passed. My mother would be tinkled to know that I was awarded a scholarship in her honor.

A little background, I am 37 years old, have been married 13 years to a US veteran with 2 beautiful children. I am originally from Charles County but when we came back home after my husband's tour was over, we decided to move to St. Mary's County. I have been a stay-at-home mom most of my kids' lives, going on 12 years now. I am now ready to venture out into the world with a career of my own. It is time.

I chose CSM because it was financially the right idea at the time. When I signed up and took my first 3 classes I did not receive financial aid. I selected my major which is Human Services because I want to be a substance abuse counselor. This degree is close to my heart because I struggled with drug addiction too. And so did my mother who was a single mother my whole life. I have been clean and sober for over 9 months now and I want



to eventually give back to the community, give back to people like me. I plan on finishing my degree at CSM and transferring to Salisbury for a bachelor's in social work through their transfer agreement. I think this is the best idea for me because Salisbury has a satellite program for social work in Hollywood, MD. If that fails, then I will apply to Old Dominion University or Stevenson's because they have transfer agreements with CSM also.

I was in total shock when I was awarded this scholarship. It made this old lady so happy and made me feel important. Your money is going to be put to great use. Look out for me in the community in four years guys. Thank you for this huge opportunity.

A little bit about myself is I am 19, I turn 20 this Sunday. My whole life I played lacrosse, but now I have shifted all my focus into work, school, and volunteering to help with the substance use disorder and mental health crisis.

I started going to CSM in 2020 while I was still in high school. January of this year, I walked across the stage to get my associate degree; I still attend CSM, I am working on getting all of my prerequisites for Salisbury's Social Work program. My goal is to get my master's degree in social work. I am currently a primary therapist at Recovery Centers of America, and I want to continue to go higher in this field. In my childhood I dealt with a lot in my life dealing with substance use and mental health. Thankfully through these dark times, I had social workers help me get through it. There is a crisis going on right now, the number one cause of death for people under 50 is overdose. People are dying due to a disease, and it is not getting the attention it needs, or the help. If this many people were dying from cancer, everyone would be trying to put a stop, but there is so many inaccurate stigmas around addiction. We are losing so many people



to this; it is my passion and my goal to continue schooling to be able to open my own treatment house or center to help these people who need it. The company I work for kick out patients the same day if insurance does not approve coverage their stay, I want to find a way to help people that is not just about money or insurance. CSM is genuinely helping me make this dream come true, even before this scholarship. For example, Professor Tatiana has taught me so much and made my passion even stronger.

I could not thank you enough for this opportunity and this blessing. I am so grateful to be chosen for the Southern Maryland Women's League Scholarship, it will be a huge impact in my for both my schooling and my career.
